*This Rosary meditation has been adapted from a life-long practice of the Catholic Rosary together with a commitment to Anglican theology and inclusive language. Grounded in Holy Scripture, this prayer discipline engages the body with the beads, and the mind in the rhythm of the prayers and the meditations on the mysteries and the graces, allowing the heart and soul to open to the presence and leading of God.*

*Typically Anglicans pray four groups of seven beads, and Catholics pray five groups of ten beads. This, being a via media adaptation, uses five groups of seven beads - the number seven symbolizing spiritual perfection, completeness, and the work or action of God, as in ancient and Biblical understanding. The Hail Mary is the Catholic version and the Gloria is the Anglican version. The Closing Prayer, the Prayer After the Rosary, and the final two Glorious mysteries have also been adapted to reflect an Anglican perspective.*

## THE JOYFUL MYSTERIES

### First Meditation: The Annunciation

The Angel Gabriel tells Mary she is going to have a child. She will name the child Jesus, and he will be the Savior of the world.

*Pray the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of **humility**.*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Move to the next single bead and pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those  
who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom,  
and the power, and the glory,  
forever and ever. Amen.

Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your Name,  
your kingdom come,

*Pray the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of **charity**:*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those  
who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those  
who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those  
who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,

*Pray the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of **zeal for God.***

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Then say this closing prayer:*

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

# THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES

*Holding the cross and make the sign of the cross, saying:*

In The Name of God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. Amen.

*If you want to pray for someone, remember them now, then say the Apostles' Creed.*

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,

the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Just before he died, Jesus went to pray in a garden. He knew he was going to die soon, and at first, he asked God if it could be different. But then he remembered that God has a plan, so he said, 'Your will, not mine be done.'

*the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of repentance.*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

Then:

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those  
who trespass against us.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Then say this closing prayer:*

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

*Holding the cross and make the sign of the cross, saying:*

In The Name of God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. Amen.

*If you want to pray for someone, remember them now, then say the Apostles' Creed.*

*Pray the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of **hope**.*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,  
hallowed be thy Name,  
thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,

thy kingdom come,  
thy will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those  
who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation,  
but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the kingdom,  
and the power, and the glory,  
forever and ever. Amen.

Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your Name,  
your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread.  
Forgive us our sins

## **Fourth Meditation: Reconciliation of the World to God**

*Pray the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of **humility**.*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Still holding the single bead, pray the Lord's Prayer.*

Our Father, who art in heaven,

*Pray the Hail Mary seven times – once on each bead – asking God for the grace of **generosity**.*

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

*Then:*

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now and will be forever. Amen.

*Then say this closing prayer:*

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

*Now holding the cross, make the sign of the cross, saying:*

God, help me to grow in grace and be made a faithful witness of the Good News for you.

In The Name of God, Creator, Redeemer, and Sanctifier. Amen.
